Htet Aung Kyaw has
Aung San Suu Kyi
watching over his work,
and if he turns his back,
he will easily know what
time it is in Rangoon.

- They think it is crazy. It is crazy!

Rangoon is the capital, not Naypyidaw. Maung Win left Burma years ago, and travelled to Norway with his wife and daughter. His parents and siblings are still in Burma, and he doesn't speak with them on the phone regularly.

- I call them sometimes, but not too often. The government in Burma knows who I am, so I will put them in a dangerous position if I call them often, he says.

## Chief and cameraman

In a closed room next to the little kitchen, the chief editor, Aye Chan Naing, is busy controlling the robot camera in the studio.

- When you work with the Democratic Voice of Burma, you have to do all kinds of jobs, Maung Win explains.
- We're not enough people, so all the employees have to be able to do all kinds of jobs. The television anchor is also the World News editor, for instance. Naing nods, and focuses on one of the nine big screens in his little control room. Right now he's the cameraman, later today he will be the chief again.
